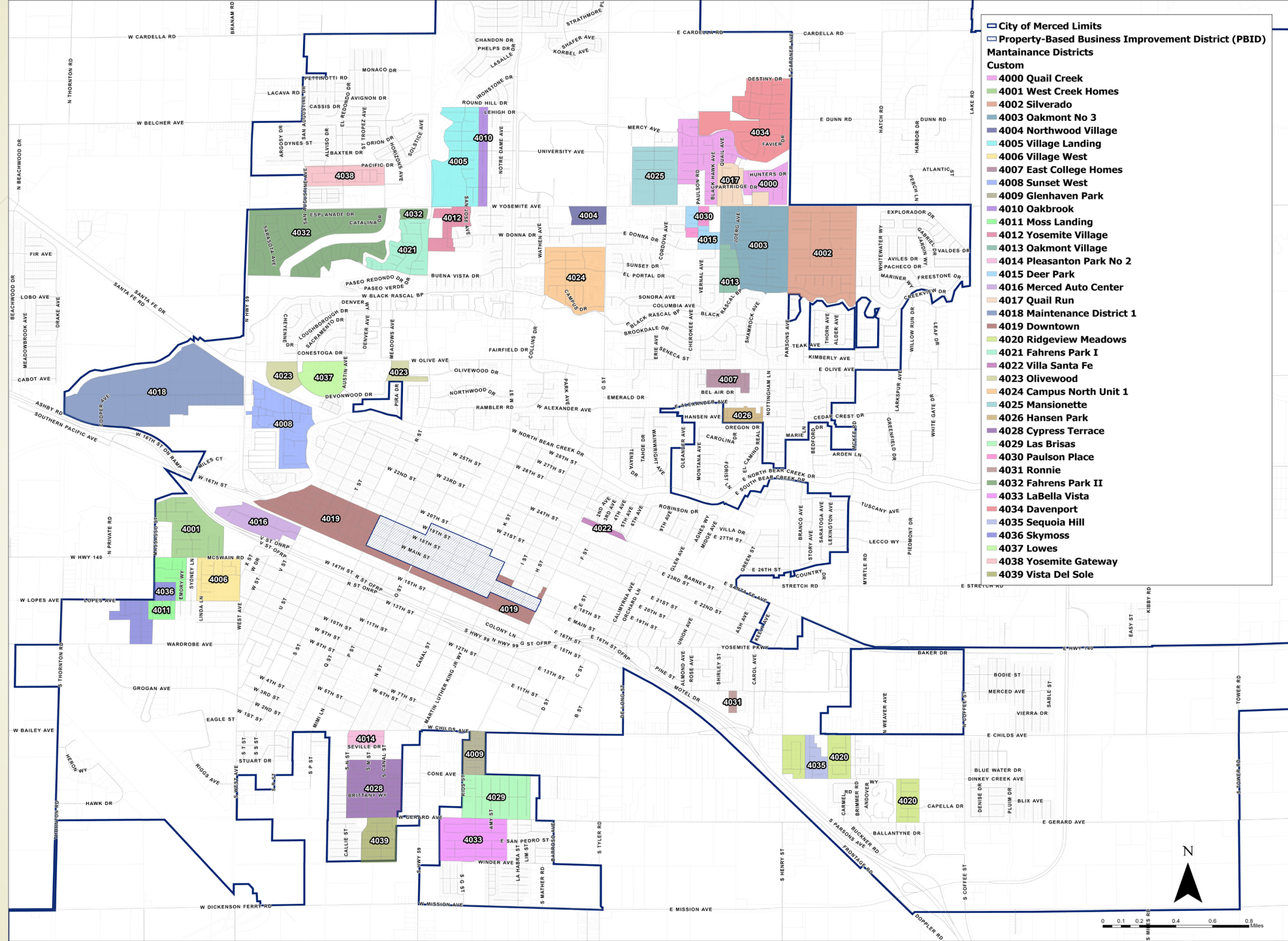
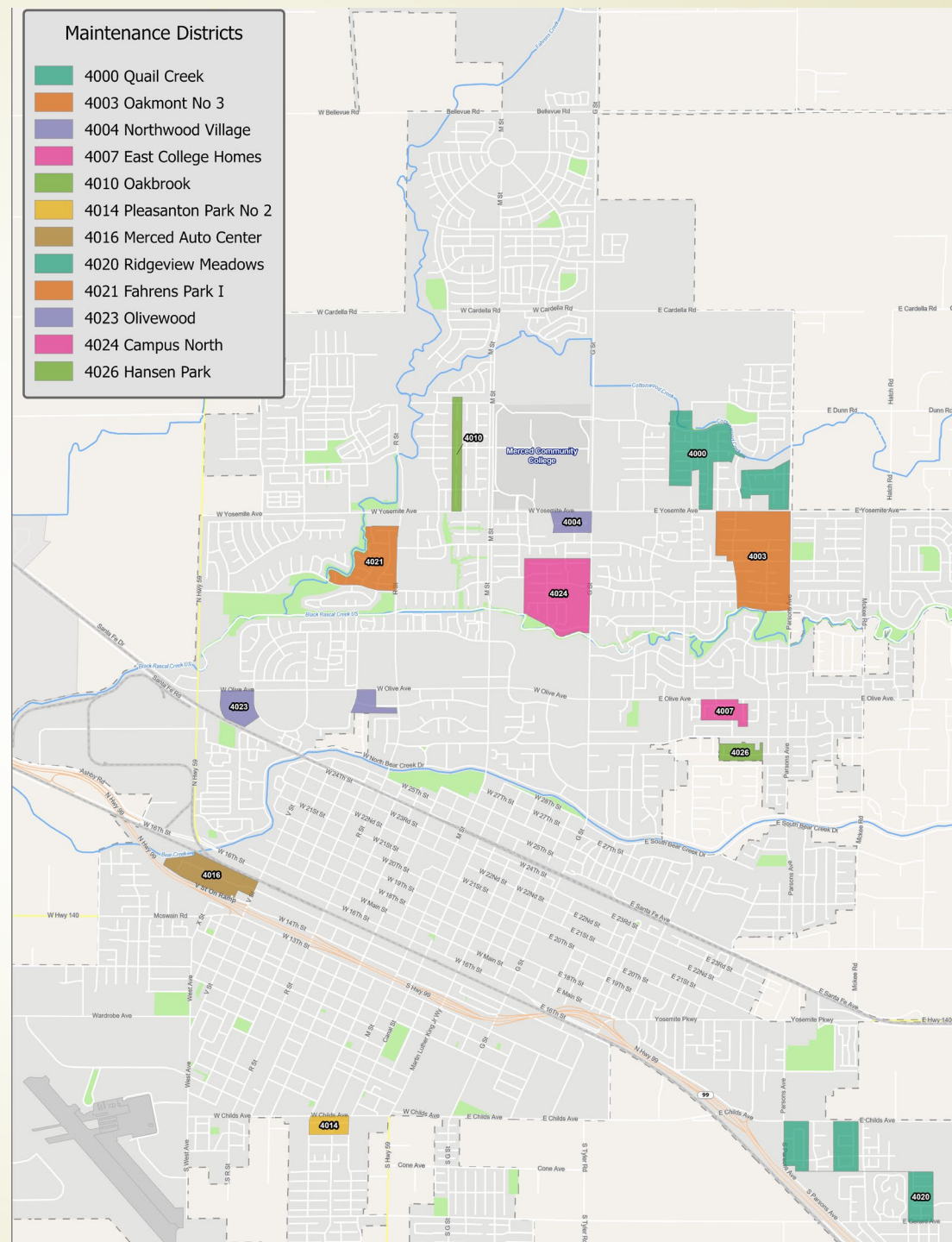

Maintenance Districts Map







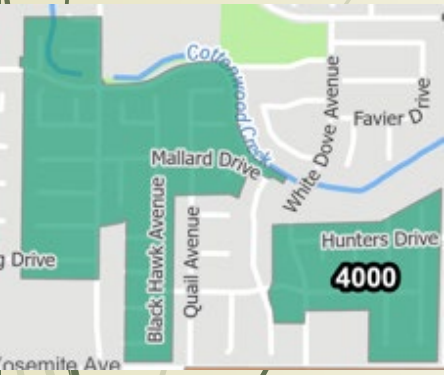
Underfunded Maintenance Districts

- 12 Maintenance Districts are underfunded and in jeopardy of having a reduction of services in storm pump maintenance, landscaping services, or both
- Assessment increases to these Maintenance Districts are being proposed to cover necessary expenses

Definition of Terms on Engineer's Reports

- Admin – Portion of costs for City Council, City Manager, City Clerk, City Attorney, Finance, and Purchasing based on number of parcels and/or acreage in the District
- PW – Portion of cost for Public Works administrative employees based on number of parcels and/or acreage in the District
- DSC – Direct Service Charges for services provided by Parks, Sewer, Streets, Wastewater, and Refuse employees to the District (where applicable)
- Support Services – Charges for services provided by other City employees/departments to the District

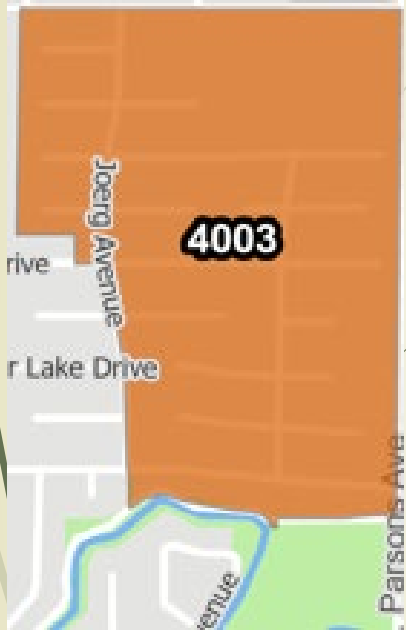

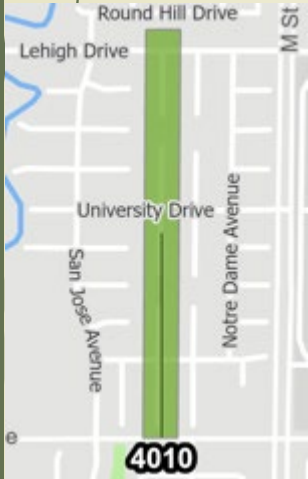

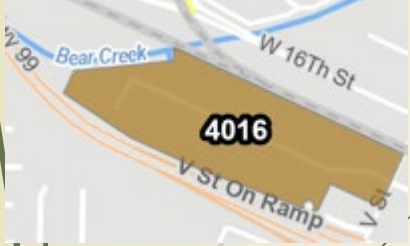

NOTE:

There are areas outside the boundaries of the maintenance district that are serviced by the storm drainage system. The MS&S costs for storm drain, therefore, have been reduced. Calculations are based on a total design pumping rate of 3,600 gallons per minute. The Auto Center requires a pumping rate of 360 gallons per minute, so their portion of the storm drain would be 10%. The City will contribute 90% of the storm drain MS&S costs.

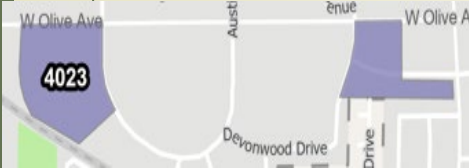

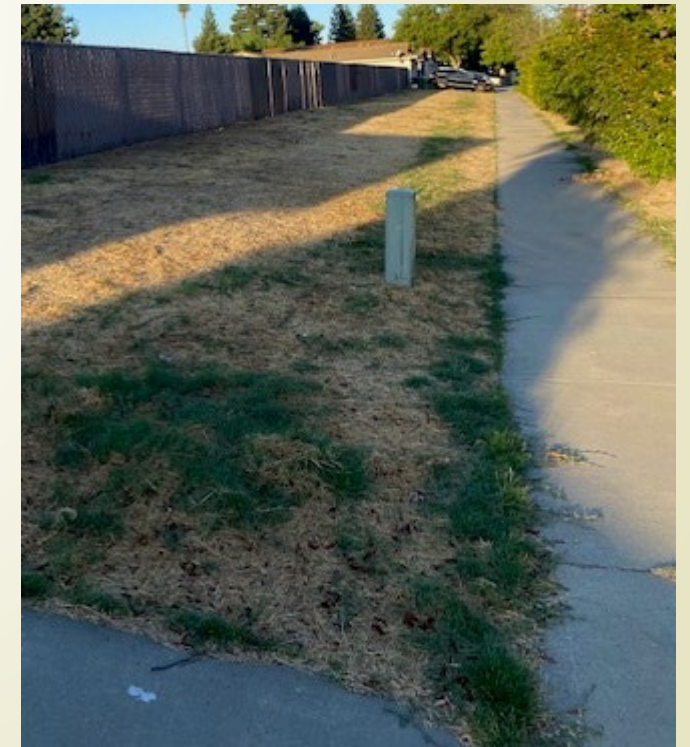

What's Next?

- Council to approve a supplemental budget appropriation from the Unreserved Fund Balance of the General Fund in the amount not to exceed \$16,546, to cover the assessment balloting proceeding noticing costs for 1,939 parcels
- Council to set a public hearing for January 20, 2026, to obtain property owner approval prior to increase in annual assessment levy
- 45 days prior to the scheduled public hearing, ballot cover letters, notices, and forms will be mailed to each property owner on record informing them of the proposed increase in levy and other prudent balloting information
- Public Works staff will hold informational meetings to answer questions from the public regarding the proposed assessment increase prior to the January 20, 2026, public hearing
- Council holds a public hearing to determine voter approval of increased assessments, and the public hearing is continued to a subsequent meeting to allow time to open and tally the sealed ballots
- Following the “continued” public hearing, Council adopts a resolution approving, confirming, and adopting the Engineer’s Reports based on the results of the ballots
