There is an excitement about opening up the community center, but we want to ensure that the community is that center of the center. So we are spending time walking the community and having conversations.

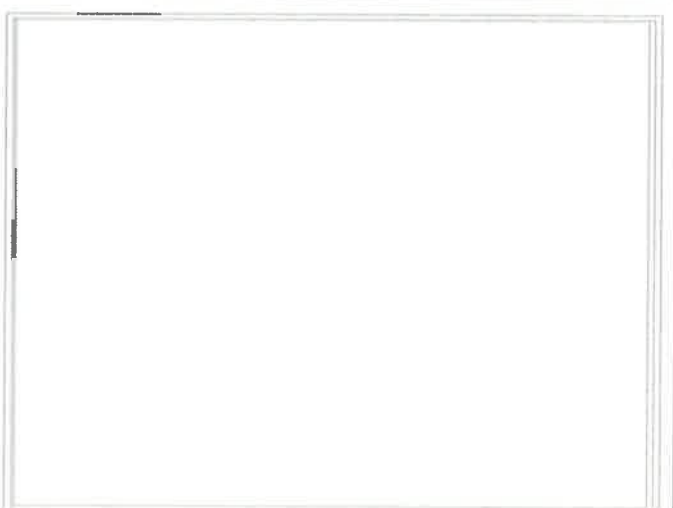
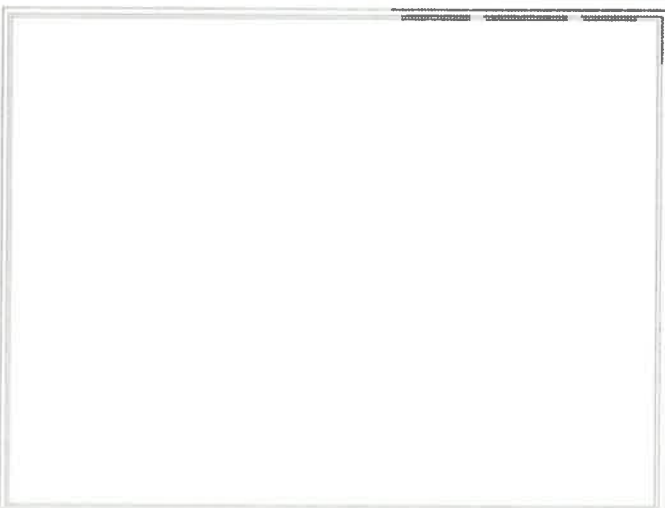
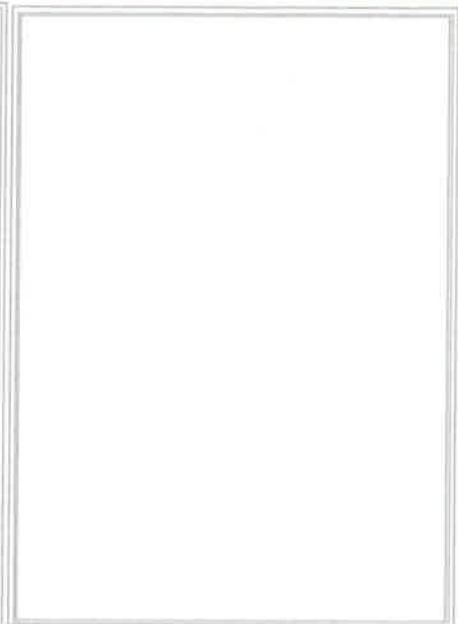
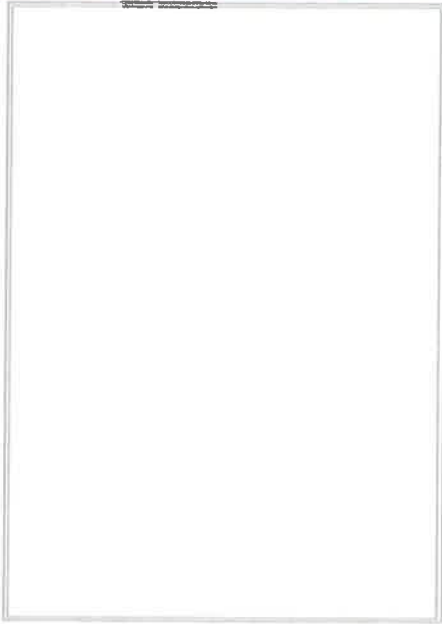

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Things never go as fast as we want, but we are moving forward. Some repairs had to be made before we could have community members in, and that is almost completed.

We are opening the center on May 4th for our youth activities after the roof repair has been completed.

Every day we are walking the neighborhood, engaging with community members and things ready.

The center is now fully equipped with what is needed and we already have some community events going on:

We are hosting the Neighbors Unidos group, which is helping community members find their voice to speak up on topics of their interest and to learn about how the city council functions and how to speak up during a meeting. We meet twice a month.

We partnered with Merced College for their first ever off campus extreme registration event that is happening on the 27th of this month. MC will have school/career coaches, financial aid people, and registration people at the center for a one-stop event. MC is reaching out to the communities that have not been able to come before.

We will be hosting a monthly Foster Care support group.

We are waiting for Steady Studios to receive funding to provide lego coding classes and we are waiting for the Central Valley Pride to reorganize.

We are thankful for the partnership with Central Valley Community Foundation who are helping with some of the Funding.
