SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MERCED AND THE MERCED MULTICULTURAL ARTS CENTER (MAC) WITH FUNDS PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY OF MERCED FOR TECHNICAL UPGRADES TO THE MULTICULTURAL ARTS CENTER (MAC) BLACK BOX THEATER

THIS AGREEMENT, entered this day of	, 2025 , by and
between the City of Merced (herein called the "Grantee") and The	Merced
Multicultural Arts Center (MAC) (herein called the "Subrecipient"	°).

WHEREAS, the Grantee has received funds from Merced County to support the activities and programs of the Merced Multicultural Arts Center (MAC);

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the responsibilities of the Grantee and Subrecipient in accomplishing the objectives of the funded activities;

WHEREAS, Grantee agrees to engage the services of Subrecipient, and Subrecipient agrees to perform the services for Grantee hereinafter described, for the compensation, during the term, and otherwise subject to the covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged and agreed, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I. SCOPE OF SERVICE.

General Statement:

The MAC's black box theater has served the community for over 25 years. However, as the center's programming has grown, its technical capabilities have not kept pace. Upgrades to the lighting system and the integration of projection technology are critical to ensuring the MAC continues to serve as a professional, flexible, and inspiring venue for the community.

1. Program Delivery:

Activity #1: Lighting Upgrades

- Modern Light Board: Provides precise control for dynamic and immersive lighting designs, enhancing theatrical and multimedia productions.
- LED Fixtures: Energy-efficient fixtures improve color rendering, reduce heat output, and cut operational costs.
- Power Modules: Ensure reliable power distribution and operation of the new lighting equipment.
- Remote Control Capabilities: Streamline design and rehearsal processes by allowing lighting adjustments from anywhere in the theater.

Activity #2: Community and Artistic Benefits

- Enhance Production Quality: Modern lighting will elevate performances, allowing directors, designers, and artists to realize their creative visions fully.
- Expand Access: A versatile, modern theater will support diverse configurations, from thrust to in-the-round, accommodating plays, musicals, dance, and speaker events.
- Empower Youth and Emerging Artists: Advanced technical tools will provide invaluable hands-on experience for youth and aspiring technicians, fostering new talent.
- Strengthen Community Engagement: Improved infrastructure will attract new collaborations and increase attendance, reinforcing the MAC's role as a cultural hub.
- 2. Specific Requirements:

To prioritize needs and allocate funding effectively, we propose a tiered budget:

- Tier 1: Modern Light Board (ETC Element 2)
- Tier 2: Light Board, Monitors, Remote Functionality, and Power Module
- Tier 3: Additional LED Fixtures to enhance stage coverage

II. COMPENSATION.

Payment by the City to the Subrecipient for actual services rendered under this Agreement shall be made upon presentation of an invoice detailing the services performed under the Scope of Services, in accordance with the fee schedule set

forth in Exhibit "A" attached here to and incorporated herein for reference. The Subrecipient agrees to provide all services required under the Scope of Services in Exhibit "A" within the compensation amount set forth in Exhibit "A". For the MAC's services rendered under this Agreement, City shall pay Consultant the not-to-exceed sum of Fourteen Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-Seven Dollars and Sixty-Five Cents (\$14,427.65).

III. METHOD OF PAYMENT.

Compensation to the Subrecipient shall be paid by the City after submission by Subrecipient of an invoice delineating the services performed.

IV. GENERAL CONDITIONS

A. General Compliance

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the requirements

B. "Independent Contractor"

The Subrecipient shall at all times remain an "independent contractor" and its employees shall not be employees of or have a contractual relationship with Grantee with respect to the services to be performed under this Agreement.

C. Indemnity/Hold Harmless

Except as to the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the City, the Subrecipient shall agree to indemnify, protect, defend (with counsel selected by the City), save, and hold the City, its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers harmless from any and all claims, suits, charges, judgments, actions, damages, or whatsoever that arise out of the Subrecipient's performance or nonperformance of the services or subject matter called for in this Agreement.

D. Insurance & Bonding

The Subrecipient shall carry sufficient insurance coverage to protect contract assets from loss due to theft, fraud, and/or undue physical damage. Prior to the City's execution of this Agreement, Subrecipient shall provide copies of insurance policies or original certificates and additional insured endorsements evidencing the coverage required by this Agreement.

E. Grantee Recognition

The Subrecipient shall ensure recognition of the role of the Grantee in providing services through this Agreement. All activities, facilities, and items utilized pursuant to this Agreement shall be prominently labeled as to funding source.

F. Amendments

The Grantee or Subrecipient may amend this Agreement at any time provided that such amendments make specific reference to this Agreement and are executed in writing.

- G. Remedies for Non-Compliance / Suspension or Termination
- H. Inconsistent or Conflicting Terms in Agreement and Exhibits

In the event of any contradiction or inconsistency between any attached document(s) or exhibit(s) incorporated by reference herein and the provisions of the Agreement itself, the terms of the Agreement shall control.

I. Ambiguities

This Agreement has been negotiated at arms' length between persons knowledgeable in the matters dealt with herein. Accordingly, any rule of law that would require interpretation of any ambiguities in this Agreement against the party that drafted this Agreement is of no application and is hereby expressly waived.

J. Venue

This Agreement and all matters relating to it shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and any action brought relating to this agreement shall be held exclusively in a state court in the County of Merced.

K. Authority to Execute

The person or persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the parties hereto warrants and represents that they have the authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of their entity and bind their party to the performance of its obligations hereunder.

L. Counterparts

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts with each counterpart being deemed an original.

V. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid, the remainder of the Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and all other parts of this Agreement shall nevertheless be in full force and effect.

VI. SECTION HEADINGS AND SUBHEADINGS

The section headings and subheadings contained in this Agreement are included for convenience only and shall not limit or otherwise affect the terms of this Agreement.

VII. WAIVER

The Grantee's failure to act with respect to a breach by the Subrecipient does not waive its right to act with respect to subsequent or similar breaches.

VIII. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Grantee and the Subrecipient for the use of funds received under this Agreement and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous communications and proposals.
