Our weekly food pantry is picking up and we have between 30-60 families come every week (depending how much food we have available).

We went a various field trip over the summer, including the water park in Fresno and Monterey.

We have an ongoing AA group for younger people and starting an MA group soon.

Our ESL classes are going well and we have graduated our first2 people.
