During the month of June here at BGC we have experienced many positives. One of our biggest accomplishment
during this period is our partnership with Bank of America. Through this partnership we have curated opportunities for 11 youth volunteers seeking experience within this career sector, these individuals are sponsored by Bank of America. In the month of June we were able to interview, train, and allowed the volunteers to begin working on at our main site. This summer we have also seen a tremendous growth within our program. The Boys and Girls club has expanded thoroughout Merced, to 4 new school sites through our partnership with Merced City School District. This opportunity with Merced City School District has allowed us to expand job opportunities to interested individuals and provide new specialty programs and opportunities for former and new Boys and Girls club member to experience.
Another significant highlight of our programming that we have prepared and added is our Hoops Clinic. With fundings through the Dignity Health, we were able to create a structured basketball program at multiple sites and draw in new BGC members who were only interested in playing basketball for us. With this funding, we are planning a big "end-of-summer" tournament between our different sites.

One significant loss that we have noticed is the decline in the number of Summer Attendees at our main site this summer. Although total attendance overall has drastically increase, the decline of attendees at the McCombs Youth Center is attributed to the opening of the new Satellite Sites in Merced; this calculated assumption derives from seeing many former BGC members attending one of our four Satellite Sites (Peterson, Stowell, Rivera, and Sheehy).
