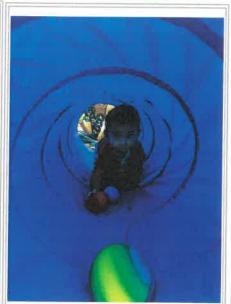

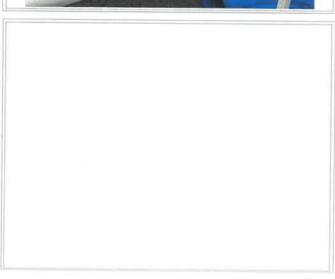


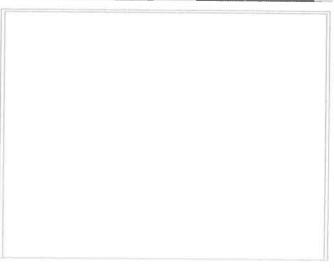

Challenged Family Resource Center was able to purchase \$5,000 (from Family Empowerment Center funds) of inclusive educational toys and materials to use at the Merced Playgroup.

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
