Jaden GONZALES-BURNHYER - spoke in support of using the funding for homeless issues and youth programs.

Nathalie MORENO, Merced - spoke in favor of a guaranteed basic income for youth.

Christian NUNEZ, Merced - advocated for open parks for the youth.
