BUDGET UPDATE

- Department has been awarded \$77,000 in grant funding for memorial at General Vang Pao Park
 - Park design is at 65% and moving to 95% next month. Hope to be out for Bid by December 2025 and in contract by March 2026
- Department has received authorization from Merced County to use allocated funding for CP42 South
 - Assessing priorities and costs to add additional field (5 total),
 court lighting, and additional parking and restrooms
 - Still determining affordable expenses
 - MOU is being requested for extension to June 30th 2026

- Rope climber for kinesthetic interaction





HIGH SPEED Rail UPDate

- California's high-speed rail project is slated to receive \$1 billion a year in funding through the state's cap-and-trade program through 2045 a relief to lawmakers who had urged the Legislature to approve the request as billions of dollars in federal funding remain in jeopardy.
- State leaders called the move, which is pending a final vote from the Legislature, a
 necessary step to cementing investments from the private sector an area of
 focus for project officials. And the project's chief executive, Ian Choudri, said the
 agreement is crucial to completing the current priority a 171-mile portion from
 Merced to Bakersfield by 2033.
- "This funding agreement resolves all identified funding gaps for the Early Operating Segment in the Central Valley and opens the door for meaningful public-private engagement with the program," Choudri said in a statement. "And we must also work toward securing the long-term funding — beyond today's commitment — that can bring high-speed rail to California's population centers, where ridership and revenue growth will in turn support future expansions."
