The Catholic Charity building on Main Street is a particular problem, handing out food to homeless drug addicts that just gets left all over Main Street, trash everywhere, every day. It is only getting worse. Businesses are suffering, with clients not wanting to wade through the piles of trash or fearing for their safety downtown as drug addled homeless men scream and terrorize them, with no help from Merced Police. All this money spent renovating the Tioga/Mainzer/El Cap buildings will be a gigantic flop without addressing the vast homeless problem downtown. I have personally lost many clients in the last year, not just due to the pandemic, but due to the horrific situation downtown with homelessness. It is not safe, and people do not want to shop there.

Imagine investing in young people with entrepreneurship opportunities and in up- or re-skilling people who ARPA targets, people living at or below the poverty line and people of color. Also, more than 20% of Cannabis dollars should be used for community beautification (aka Parks and Rec). It is important that outside spaces be pleasant, green, vibrant, and representative of the community. This pandemic is here for the long-term and having outdoor spaces, places, and events is so important as we adapt into our "new normal. The City should explore more empowering methods of engaging with the community than just a survey. ARPA is for those who have been most impacted by Covid. People of color and people who now live in poverty have been impacted most negatively because of the pandemic. As such, the city should follow the INTENT of ARPA and use data of these highly impacted peoples and invest the dollars in alleviating their lives with dignified and sustainable wages, and equitable opportunities and access. This is not a survey that takes an equity lens. Please do better next time--all times.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING. This town has zero available affordable housing. As a family of four, 2 adults and 2 children, two adults both working full time jobs still don't make enough money to rent a home sufficient enough for their family. It is literally economically impossible. Without affordable housing, and landlord co tinting to UP RENT to benefit their own pockets. The homeless issue will continue to rise. Helping out the essential workers who put their health on the line and worked through the pandemic

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Besides gun safety classes for councilmen who shop at FoodMaxx, a great way to spend the money would be to put most of it into the police department, since fear of spreading COVID in jails has led to the governor ordering the release of numerous inmates and disallowing the booking of a lot of felons with \$0 bail and reduced jail capacities when they go under outbreak status. Things such as more officers, reopening the city jail, or a new north station, be it the Sun-Star building or from the ground up, would make this governor-induced situation a bit more bearable. A lot of these people are repeat offenders who should have been in jail without the ability to offend again so guickly, but since they can, they know that they can get away with it again, and then think "I wonder what else I can get away with!". These people who steal, trespass, and/or vandalize on a regular basis, break the same cell phone store windows as soon as they're replaced, commit arson, expose themselves, brandish guns in grocery stores (besides self defense), and commit hit and run with bodily harm, should not be able to go home the night that they're caught, be it to a house or a tent, but they have been ever since this all began. I should not have to think twice about rolling up the back door at my workplace or opening a window in my own apartment, but I have ever since March 2020, not because of the virus, but because of the emptying jails, which I acknowledge are not the fault of the city or county. Crumbling roads and wastewater are not COVID problems, and most of the homeless choose to be that way so that they can get away with things more easily, and won't accept anything that the money would be spent on. (In Fresno last year, only 1% of homeless people accepted any kind of assistance offered by the police.) Most of them should be housed in a jail cell in the first place.

Improve bikeways and pathways. Get rid of homeless people who are being dropped off from other communities.

Get the homeless camp buy the 99 freeway entrance cleaned up and gone... It's just a mess. A site for new people whom visit our city... the gateway to Yosemite...

Recent visitors from another area of CA recently told me that they couldn't believe how trashy Merced looked. Between the homeless and garbage left by these individuals, the community is looking in sad shape. I don't know what the answer is, but other communities MUST have had some success with the homeless population that we can learn from.

I believe that these funds should be used to support our hardest hit and most deeply impacted, we should formulate more social safety nets for the members of this community so they don't have to worry about missing

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work when the state's pandemic pay ends this month, especially working parents who have to choose between taking days off or sending their child to school sick. I also think we should invest in rapid testing at our school sites, and a better public health message so people will get vaccinated. funding for public webinars to explain how the vaccine works, funding for webinars to explain common myths and misconceptions about covid and the vaccine. and also webinars or social media postings debunking common conspiracy theories. our public health department needs to do a better job communicating these things to the public. videos we can watch and share. our main priority should be on keeping our kids safe this school with the delta variant raging and the only way to do that is to get more vaccines in arms and passing a city wide mask mandate again. also programs to help kids who may have fallen behind this school year, therapy/counselors in schools to help children who have lost family members or friends, I am sure lots of children could use professional mental health after this pandemic they have been through. and we should keep these counselors in schools, instead of SRO officers. fund more social and mental health programs for our children to keep them off the streets.

1. BRING IN NEW GOOD BUSINESSES!! Not the 99cent stores, cannabis stuff that will increase city revenues in itself. Take all homeless up into the mountains near a stream so they have water to drink,bathe, wash if they want then take supplies weekly to them but get that eyesore out of this town!! Atwater is growing bigger, BETTER than Merced and that is shameful!! Reduce taxes on W corps, S corps so we can keep them here., that will help the job market, the revenues, the housing industry and all! Spend money helping small businesses get up and running again. Our 2 store mall went down the tubes, now outdoor mall with WHAT? Lets get the shopping open again but get rid of homeless first or you will never cure any problem, that we have here. One ride through this town and they go elsewhere likely having experienced these issues before so make moving homeless top priority!! I work for Dignity health only hospital in town have received no hazard pay for working with Covid-19 patients. Have been exposed several times thankfully not infected. We need hazard pay our dept are the front line workers caring for Covid-19 lives. Yet we are often the forgotten hero's.

Please visit Happy Hollow Park in San Jose. We need to upgrade Applegate Park, Applegate Zoo and Kiddieland to make it an attraction similar to Happy Hollow. Our kids have been hit hard by pandemic and our community would benefit. It would also help to beautify our city while also be a great youth program.

Merced has focused too much on catering to the UC, and revitalizing downtown with bars and restaurants for adults to party, when families and kids have nothing to do. We need more housing, code enforcement, better city planning, and public safety to create safer neighborhoods. Pedestrian safety and roads need serious improvement, new crosswalks painted, etc. It is very dangerous for people to walk in Merced, especially kids walking to and from school.

As a prior service adult White Male Conservative I assure you there is no plan that will ever include me for any assistance nor relief. Because people were afraid of covid and refused to come to work we did 2 or 3 bodies of labor every day. Because of this, there were days i could not physically lift myself out of bed and ultimately had to quit my job. I never qualified for the company medical insurance and private coverage was too expensive. I still cannot afford to be seen. There is no incentive for someone to hire me in a new job and choices are limited as I can't labor in ag anymore. I don't know if this helps but maybe someone will hear me this time.

Merced is experiencing a true housing shortage and crisis. Once the eviction moratorium is lifted, many tenants will be asked to move due to not caring for their properties during the pandemic. There will be many homes that are uninhabitable and in disrepair that will cost thousands of dollars to fix and make rentable or sellable. Many landlords will not have the funds to repair them. As a property management company, we are rehabbing a very typical 3bed, 2 bath residential home now that will exceed \$60k in repairs—the roach infestation is so severe that electrical is not working, all appliances need to be replaced, the yard is dead, the countertops are corroded, etc etc etc. You can imagine how filthy living can destroy a property, devalue a neighborhood and result in this kind of destruction. Our ask is that you set funds aside for residential property owners who's investments are in disrepair and therefore not habitable for less than \$20k in repairs.

First take care of our elderly and poor people. Then improve of our infrastructure. More wages won't help workers (gov and FR's). They have jobs, so what they need is support in the form of mental health services. They need a different kind of support, emotional support. We should honor them in some way to make them feel good. Giving them more money (hazard pay) is not the best way to show them that we love them, and it takes money away from where it's needed more. Elderly and poor people need it more. Giving workers more money wont make them happy in the long run. They will soon forget it, whereas honoring them might create a lasting of accomplishment and great memories. Money would be better spent using it to bring relief to the elderly and poor and homeless people who are suffering.

open a duane's restaurant

Care must be taken not to give money directly to people but to the services (such as rent assistance) with auditing. Unfortunately, when funds are given directly to some individuals they are not seeing the importance of going to work. Look at the businesses that are looking for workers. I am seeing too many people use the money for nonessential needs instead of paying for rent or food.

Streets and sidewalks are very important to me. I had a serious tripping accident while walking in my neighborhood. My husband hit a large deep pothole and did serious damage to his vehicle. We are long term residents and want to enjoy our neighborhood; du to the deterioration of the streets and sidewalks this is hazardous. We are of the senior population.

It makes the area look bad). The homeless issue needs to be addressed. Have more interaction with the university & their status of covid 19 cases and mitigation practices. Inside contacts say nothing is being done but daily reports of positive cases and exposures. Health department should be concerned.

A very low or no interest loan program for local businesses to use for infrastructure/expansion needs would be very helpful. For example, to use for ADA compliance construction, large repairs such as roofs, facilities improvements, equipment upgrades, fleet expansion, etc. These normally high cost improvements would allow our local businesses to grow quickly and hire more people. The same idea/program applies to housing. There are streets where you sit at a red light with no cars coming the opposite direction, the signal finally changes (2 cars fly through on a red light) then traffic backs up that direction. I see this every single day on Donna and G street in particularly, as well as other streets.

The biggest problem in Merced right now is vaccine hesitancy. There will be no progress on anything else until this fundamental problem is addressed. And this problem is related to lack of education, people believing misinformation, and leaders at all levels and in all institutions not always acting in the best interests of the people living within their jurisdictions.

It would be nice to invest some of the money in maintaining the bike paths - Bear Creek and Rascal Creek. They could do with clean up, care of the vegetation and regular patrolling for safety. Thank you.

Currently in North Merced near El Capitan High School where what looks like the highest rate of homes being built it seems that the city has given up sidewalks, bike paths and other safe routes from the Bellevue Ranch neighborhood. On G Street and Bellevue Rd. for instance there's literally no safe way for UC students to travel by bike to and from the neighborhood to school, there's no safe manner of bike or walk travel from the

neighborhood to Chenoweth middle school. Near Cardella and G it's like the city and/or county just flat out gave up. The Chenoweth buses are so full my son had to sit or stand on the floor when he attended that school. There's an exponential rate of family and student growth here but there has been next to no investment in the beautification of areas around Bankcroft Rd and Cardella. UC students would benefit greatly from a safe bike path from G street down Bellevue Rd towards the UC. A kid died in that road recently and there has been no effort to increase lighting or safety measures on that road. Many of these students who live in this area have no alternatives other than biking down this road. On the corner of Cardella and G st. The bike path quite literally ends. People drive like maniacs on G st. My teenage son, neighbor kids and adults would benefit from a safe path of travel from this neighborhood to the Hospital, to the Raley's shopping zone and to Chenoweth middle school. The landscape on Bankcroft, on Bixby and on Merrill is total garbage. The city wants expansion and needs revenue and is encouraging the building of big beautiful homes on land that they refuse to make safe for families. The juxtaposition here is interesting but mostly frustrating to families who have paid a substantial amount for their homes in an area ripe for improvement and growth that looks as though it's surrounded by weed growth, barren dirt and unsafe paths half-built. What's the plan here? SMART goals that coincide with the city's growth plan or building houses for the sake of building houses. Let's make this area safe so folks are more willing to venture outside. Give them a safe break from the monotony of Covid isolation. Invest in the community!

Can the City consider offering help to landlords like me that want to fix the home but don't have the financial means to do so? I'm very worried about further vandalism to the property as well.

Some parks with basketball courts, soccer fields, splash pad and opportunities to stay active. All of the schools with courts are locked after school hours. Many of the local parks don't have any or enough courts for children to be active. Also support/funding for organized sports programs that would make it affordable for families to participate. Those in agriculture have been among the hardest hit, and also tend to be undocumented and cannot access the labor market, healthcare, and other services and resources that are essential to their health. This group, in addition to others (the houseless, other undocumented immigrant groups, etc) need resources to weather this pandemic, and their worthiness should not depend on how much they contribute to the economy (e.g., don't just provide

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services to "essential" immigrants). Lastly, the city should invest in the infrastructure, as we could benefit (especially students) from better public transportation, more safe spaces to gather, safer roads (especially Bellevue towards campus!!!!), and more access to internet. Having a university here is great, but it seems that the city currently does not have the capacity to 1) support the influx of students and new residents and 2) protect those who already live here from displacement. Developing a complex with a community center

I moved to Merced in February as a chef for El Capitan hotel. I grew up in WV, lived in VA, MD, DC, and San Diego before moving up here. I've visited and stayed in every state in the continental US. Merced is a great town and I really feel at home here, but the water quality is the worst I have ever experienced. At my house, in public, at work, etc. It is so bad that my truck gets stained from mineral buildup due to sprinkler systems hitting it. We go through

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more water softener at work to treat the water than I have any where else I've ever been. I know it is a very old town, the water needs work badly.

Focus on critical infrastructure such as streets; water; plumbing; sewage.

Replace lost revenue to the City for the utility bills that weren't paid by residents during Covid

Please invest in projects that will create long-term improvement for residents which cannot be accomplished by the private sector. Some ideas: improved traffic light timing, new trees planted along walking and bike paths where old trees have died, more firefighters and police are always welcome. And a freebie - loosen the paint color restrictions for businesses so they can add at a little visual interest.

These one-time funds will make a significant impact for our city. Let's ensure that these funds are used equitably and fairly. 10 years from now, I still want to see and feel the positive impact these funds created for the city. To see and feel these changes will take time...but actions must be taken now for those changes to evolve. Home prices have gone through the roof. Merced needs more housing options. I support inclusionary housing for both south and north side of Merced. Let's make it balanced. Stonefield Homes is selling their 1600 square foot home for \$411,000. That is in the Cypress Terrace (South side) development. And there is very little backyard. Where are our children going to play? As a 30 year south side resident of Merced, I never thought I would ever see homes in south side Merced sell for \$400K+. Imagine what the homes in north side Merced are selling for. The median income for Merced in 2019 is \$45,000. No household income of \$45,000 can afford a \$400K home, and this price is one of the lowest prices you can find for a brand new built home.in Merced. Attach the cost of new solar panels mandated by law for new homes, and the prices of homes are outrageous. Is Merced City investing in non-local investors and non-local home construction companies, or is Merced City investing in creating stabilized communities that in return, will reinvest back in Merced? Secondly, the homeless issue continues to be a problem, despite recent efforts to alleviate/resolve homelessness. This is an 'entire city' issue, not just a south side or 'near Hwy 99' problem. I know that more can be done. Thirdly, if Merced wants to remain as the Gateway to Yosemite, let's beautify the city even more. Downtown, is seeing lots of improvements which has been a long time coming. Beautifying our parks, neighborhood parks, our streets, including south side, Franklin/Beachwood, Mission Ave and the Weaver District areas. These areas need a lot of road improvements and pretty landscaping. There are so many potholes on Mission Ave and there is a certain section of Mission Ave where people constantly dump their trash and mattresses and sofas onto the side of the road next to the almond orchard. Applegate Park needs a clean up

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too, especially the bathrooms. Because of the homeless issue, only one is open (closest to the playground) and is rarely cleaned and attended to. It smells and is wet all the time. Beautifying the City will attract visitors, thus helping with our tourism sector. Focus on the West and South side of Merced. Add pretty landscaping, and flowers. Having city workers and maintenance crews come out to maintain these areas will show residents that their city cares about where they live. Thus, it will help boost these communities' morale and well-being. Making the city prettier will attract and create better neighborhoods, naturally. If there is a way to add pretty landscaping to Yosemite Pkwy and all of 16th Street, Merced City should do that too. After all, those are the main roads that takes visitors and everyone into Yosemite National Park. When people drive through Merced, that is their first impression of Merced. I think first impressions are important when trying to send a message. So let's live up to live up to our name - The Gateway to Yosemite. My fourth priority would be to update and invest in the infrastructure of Merced. Our waste water and sewer systems, including old and outdated pipes needs attention and updating. Corrosion, leaks and bursts is a main concern. With all of these new homes being built, Merced needs a water and sewer system that can support all of Merced. Lastly, I'd like to see a larger part of Merced remain agricultural and farmland. A lot of these lands are being sold for housing developments. Please plan and develop Merced in such a way that keeps the balance. Seeing farmland and mountain ranges in the distance is what keeps Merced a desirable place to live.

The city and county should use the funds on issues that invest in Merced City and Merced County's future by addressing potable and non potable water infrastructure, Yosemite tourism attraction to downtown, and updating recreational parks to include hiking, biking, walking, camping, fishing, off roading, etc... This is a great opportunity to update the city.

Small business are the motor of our economy. We need to allocate most funds to small businesses. Those businesses that can PROVE they lost income should have it reimbursed. Those who continued to operate but have been suffering to find employees and help in general should be awarded financial assistance or programs that can help incentivize or promote finding/hiring employees. It's been tough in that sense. Let's not make the same mistake again and blinding pass out money to those who don't need it. It will only make it worse on small businesses, trust me.

The customer service is really not good within the programs. Are there even notes taken and added to your profile at all? It's a little earth shattering to hear I just lost 2500 that I was prepared to receive back to me or at least apply to future rent? That's been my issue with the program so far and not to mention the long time she says it will take to even start paying the utilities that they said they could. It's really hard and stressful to watch bills pile up not knowing if and when they will be paid. An added stress we don't need

It's not necessarily the city's problem but let's get the owner of the Merced Mall going on the big remodel. The place looks sad and terrible for the city. Get that tax revenue!

Expand educational and training opportunities for health care workers. We have a shortage of nurses and doctors in our community made worse by the pandemic. We need to provide scholarships and loans for students to attend nursing schools outside of Merced to lessen the waiting time for the Merced College Nursing program then a percentage of the loans can be forgiven for years worked locally.

Since the pandemic began, businesses and individuals have seen that without childcare, we can't work. Closing schools was a problem but they are opening again. Our city has a large percent of families that are young with children not yet in school. These parents cannot work without safe childcare for their little ones. Most of these parents get childcare form small home-based childcare providers (they are not in Head Start, and in childcare at schools). Unfortunately, many of these childcare providers closed and many went out of business during the pandemic. They need help to open, and meanwhile, working parents needs more childcare services. Most of these parents make just a little too much income to qualify for state-funded childcare (Usually \$15 per hour). They are

"working poor." They need affordable, safe childcare near their home or work. There are many places throughout Merced with vacant store/office space that can be converted to low-cost childcare for working low-income families. Ideally this childcare would be available from 6am to 8pm and weekends. Schools and social services will not pay for this because this problem because they see it as the employers' problem.
Housing prices in Merced have increased greatly, impacting both local residents and new college students. Affordable housing should be priority as being unhoused can ripple out to many more difficulties, financially and emotionally.
