F7. SUBJECT: REQUEST #23-24 Requesting A Clear Crosswalk Or A

Flashing Pedestrian Crosswalk To Alert Drivers Of Crossing

Pedestrians On N Street And 16th Street.

REPORT IN BRIEF

Citizen states pedestrian's cross 16th street without a clear crosswalk or a flashing crosswalk. Adding a form of protection will aid in pedestrian safety at this area.

Clerk's Note: Agenda Item F.7. was moved to be heard prior to F.1.

Member OLMOS stated that he would not support the addition of a crosswalk at N and 16th Street, noting that the safest place to cross was at either O street and M Street.

Member WILSON noted that through his own witnessing, adding a crosswalk can lead to a false sense of security and more accidents.

A motion was made by Member Olmos, seconded by Member Wilson, to deny the request and refer back to engineering. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

SUBJECT: REQUEST #23-18 Requesting Stop Signs At San Jose Ave
And W. Donna Drive, As Well As De Anza Avenue And W. Donna
Drive. Citizen Is Also Requesting The Continuance Of The Double
Yellow Line From R Street And Donna Drive To At Least M Street.

REPORT IN BRIEF

Citizen states that a curve in the road, along with the busyness of the street, makes this uncontrolled intersection (at San Jose Ave. and West Donna Dr.) prone to near misses. When school lets out, the intersection at Donna and De Anza is inundated with drivers trying to circumvent cars waiting to turn on M St. Along with the hazard that the uncontrolled intersection creates, students trying to cross are also at risk. Lastly, citizen is hoping the addition of a double line from Donna to M Street will remind drivers not to pass and create hazards for the neighbors, pedestrians, and children.

Member WEGLEY suggested the addition of the stop signs as requested.

Member OLMOS stated that if the data comes back and supports the addition of stop signs, he is in favor.

Member WILSON is in favor for the safety of divers, children, and pedestrians. Members agree.

Motion to receive information to determine if there is a basis for stop signs. Motion to approve striping along the two curves on Donna.

F2. SUBJECT: Request #23-19 School Zone Signage And/Or Lit Up
Crosswalk On 21st And Cherry Ave.

REPORT IN BRIEF

Citizen states that the intersection at Charles Wright School, on 21st and Cherry Ave. has become dangerous due to the influx of vehicles not stopping for the cross guard and pedestrians. Citizen is requesting a school zone sign and/or lit up crosswalk to prevent any danger to the crossing guard and students.

Members decide the area requested is not able to be considered a school zone.

Member NELSON also questioned the need for a lit up crosswalk when school occurs in the day time.

A motion was made by Member Parker, seconded by Member McKinnon, to deny the request. Motion to deny passed.

SUBJECT: REQUEST #23-20 Requesting A School Zone Sign, A Reduce In Speed, And A Two-Way Stop Or A Lit-Up Crossing At Charles Wright School At The 21st And Cherry Intersection.

REPORT IN BRIEF

Citizen states cars are going faster than 35 mph and do not stop for the crossing guard and students. She is requesting a school zone sign and a reduce in speed. She is also requesting a two-way stop or a lit-up

crossing to prevent any danger to pedestrians.

Members discussed how the facts remain the same as item F.2 and there is no precedent to fulfill request. Additional police enforcement was recommended by member Olmos.

A motion was made by Member Olmos, seconded by Member Wegley, to deny but request additional police enforcement in the area. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

REPORT IN BRIEF

Citizen states that there are speeders on the daily that put children and pedestrians in at risk. Citizen requests speedbumps to prevent future accidents.

Member OLMOS stated that he is not in favor of the addition of speed bumps but additional signage on Willowbrook he is in favor of.

Member NELSON agreed.

A motion was made by Member Olmos, seconded by Member Wegley, to deny the request but add additional signage on Willowbrook. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Citizen states cars speed past the intersection from both directions since there is no stop sign. This intersection creates many near misses on a daily basis.

Member NELSON states that more information is needed to see if the intersection warrants a stop/yeild sign.

F6. SUBJECT: REQUEST #23-23 Requesting A Speed Bump At The

Intersection Of El Portal Drive & Joerg Avenue To Stop Cars From

Speeding Through The Stop Sign.

REPORT IN BRIEF

Citizen states drivers are notoriously running through stop signs by either slowing down without a full stop or darting through the intersection. Very few come to a complete stop. This area becomes dangerous for people exiting the walking path located right at said intersection.

Member OLMOS recommended a larger police presence at this intersection.

Member WEGLEY noted that the stop bars are short and can be extended. Painting or repainting can also help the intersection.

Member WILSON explained how a speed bump would still prohibit the speed of emergency vehicles and noted he was for police enforcement.

Member NELSON agreed.

A motion was made by Member Wilson, seconded by Member Olmos, that this agenda item be denied with the a request for additional enforcement, extending the stop bar, and repainting the intersection. The motion carried unanimously.

SUBJECT: REQUEST #23-25 Requesting A Designated Handicap Spot In Front Of 1368 Baxter Ct. For Both The Disabled Husband And Wife.

REPORT IN BRIEF

Citizen states there are more cars parking on Baxter Ct. and specifically in front of his house. Both him and his wife are disabled and if parking is not available, he must resort to his driveway. The slope of said driveway

makes it difficult for him to get in and out of his vehicle.

Members cannot justify adding a handicap parking space.

Motion to deny request passes with the motion made by Wilson and seconded by Olmos.

Members discuss the Los Banos Ordinance and if this will work in the Clty of Merced.

Members described how beneficial this would be in terms of upkeep and availability.

Member WEGLEY offered the deletion of the proximity rule found in Los Banos Ordinance.

This Business Item was approved with the recommendation to create an ordinance like that of Los Banos with the deletion of the 50 mile proximity rule. A motion was made by Member Wegley, and seconded by Member Wilson.

Council is requesting a no parking zone on the West side of West Ave from Eagle Street to Riggs Ave due to an inundation of semi-truck parking.

Member WEGLEY offered an option to designate this area as a "no truck parking" instead of "no parking."

Members agreed with this recommendation.

A motion was made by Member Olmos seconded by Member Wegley, to approve the request and designate West Ave.as a "No Truck Parking Zone" The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Member NELSON states that there is planned development in the area that would be putting sidewalks and curb.
