Purpose	To inform California law enforcement agencies of changes to prohibitions regarding stopping, standing, or parking of a vehicle in certain areas.
Background	Current law prohibits a person from stopping, parking, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, in any of the places identified in Veh. Code §22500(a)-(m).
New Information	Effective January 1, 2024, Assembly Bill 413 (Lee, Ch. 652, Stats. 2023) adds Veh. Code §22500(n), prohibiting the stopping, standing, or parking of a vehicle within 20 feet of the vehicle approach side of an unmarked or marked crosswalk, or 15 feet of any crosswalk where a curb extension is present. Additionally, until January 1, 2025, a warning may only be issued unless the violation occurs in an area marked using paint or a sign.
