Problem Statement - In January 2023, extensive flooding necessitated emergency evacuations, rescues, sandbagging, and street closures. The Fire Dept. lacked sufficient personnel to respond to all requests in a timely matter. Merced CERT was chartered in 2003 by Merced City through a contract with the Merced County OES by accepting a FEMA CERT grant. During its 1st year of operation adult volunteers were trained & the program ceased operating after funding ended & the coordinator retired. In Jan. 2023, raging waters from local creeks flooded parts of the city forcing mandatory emergency evacuations. Five feet of flood waters entered apartments, homes, and businesses over a one-week period. The Fire Dept. had insufficient manpower to assist with evacuations, sandbagging, filling/delivering sandbags, rescuing people & animals, performing traffic control, & clearing street gutters/drains. Our citizens were trying to recover from the January floods when another storm flooded our town last week. More sandbags, manpower and traffic control were needed again. Again, we lacked sufficient personnel to respond to all requests. Had an active CERT program been in place, we could have been doing the greatest good for the greatest number of people.

Our City Council's priority is for community engagement and public safety and our mission is to prevent, prepare for and mitigate emergencies using

exceptional and visionary leadership. Therefore, we want to inform, educate and train our citizens on disaster preparedness; we want CERT volunteers to respond to local disasters & provide manpower support to our firefighters at disasters & community wide public events. We will target two areas of our community that are vulnerable & underserved. We will build two teams of 10 volunteers & hold 2 sessions per year. Volunteers will be trained in hands on CPR, disaster preparedness, minor emergency response, participating in community events & fairs. Delivery will be accomplished using our 63 public safety membership of who 19 are on duty daily. We have a bilingual workforce consisting of 2 Spanish speakers; 1 Khmer speaker; and 1 Italian speaker. We have a working relationship with the Merced Lao family to bridge any gaps in barriers to communicating with the Southeast Asian population. Our bilingual individuals have been identified and will serve as leads. The dept. has extensive experience providing hands-on CPR, emergency preparedness, & disaster drills. We have meeting rooms, a mobile refreshment trailer, equipment, and most importantly we have strong community ties to gap any unanticipated shortfalls. What we lack is funding for advertisements, PPE, mobile canopy, & promotional materials to engage the public in reactivating the program. All of this will be accomplished in 18 mos. Then, we will begin "train the trainers" & continuing program expansion to serve more vulnerable low income & ESL citizens.

Purchase PPE, disaster kit supplies, & equipment. Provide 1 month notice of upcoming training. Fire Dept. will provide 2-3 days of training using our bilingual firefighters and Merced Lao Family (for Southeast Asian translation) to deliver training to two core groups of 10 vulnerable & underserved community members about basic fire suppression, first aid, handson CPR, search & rescue, & evacuation techniques. The volunteers will assist firefighters with local disasters & in providing manpower for community wide public events. It is our goal to leverage CERT funds by utilizing CERT volunteers to play an active role in providing critical support to our firefighters allowing FF to handle the most critical functions & CERT volunteers to assist in secondary functions. We have two certified CERT trainers & two additional Fire Dept. employees are currently being certified using the Hybrid CERT training program.



Starting in late 2023 we will begin training 10 basic CERT volunteers. We will hold two sessions per year. We will target our underserved and at-risk non-English speaking Southeast Asian population by working in conjunction with the Merced Lao Family Community, Inc. to begin training 15 of their members in Basic CERT and we will reach our Hispanic/Latino population utilizing our bilingual firefighters. We already provide large-scale and mini-disaster simulations to our High-School students using live fire suppression, search & rescue, jaws of life auto extrication, triage, rescue carriers, hands on CPR, & medical operations & this grant will allow us to easily reach a wider audience who are underserved and at higher risk. At the end of the performance period, we will expand our presence, by training the volunteers to become trainers & exponentially increasing our effectiveness by leveraging the grant funds. Exempt employees & on-duty firefighters will provide training at no additional cost. We intend to distribute give aways to increase interest in the program, we will create instructional materials in Spanish and Southeast Asian. We will provide CERT kits at no cost to the volunteers. These events will also serve as recruitment opportunities & volunteers will reflect our diverse population.
