This program catered to 416 students since the first quarter. We're offering restorative lunch circles and positive alternative activities. We also provide a social emotional multi-tier system of supports for students, staff and parents. The program aimed to foster a supportive and constructive environment, reinforcing the principles of restorative justice and enhancing student well-being. \*Report: Social-Emotional Training and Preparation for Restorative Justice Youth Conferences Overview of the Program The Restorative Justice League (RJL) is committed to fostering the development of social-emotional skills and accountability in youth, equipping them to resolve conflicts, build healthier relationships, and actively contribute to positive school and community climates. Our center has recently completed a social-emotional training initiative 118 students, preparing them for participation in restorative justice youth conferences throughout the county. Through this comprehensive training program, we have empowered 118 new student mentors with the skills necessary to positively impact their schools and communities. These young leaders are now equipped to take an active role in creating restorative solutions, fostering stronger relationships, and contributing to a more equitable and just environment.
