

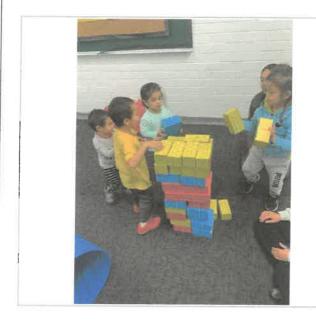

Families attended 24 in person playgroups. 33 children attended these playgroups for a total of 125 service contacts. This means children are attending multiple days this quarter. 36 parents, grandparents, or guardians guardians attended with their children this quarter. Families are being referred by word of mouth, their teachers, and medical providers.
