# **Downtown Merced Mosaic Project**

### **Project Outline/Description**

A mosaic will be created, using low relief glazed clay poppies and lupines as components (similar to mosaic shown in attached picture, except butterflies, hearts, tulips are replaced with California poppies and lupines). The mosaic will initially be installed on the front of the Bob Hart Square concrete enclosure as shown on the attached picture. Depending on the public's respond to this project the mosaic can be extended to wrap around the entire concrete enclosure. Every person living in Merced is invited to participate and glaze a poppy or lupine during the many publicly offered glazing workshops. As for the past projects, students from Yosemite High, the Wellness Center, the MCRM, the Haven of Hope and the living Well Café will help make the components for the mosaic.

### Purpose/Objective of Proposed Project

This public art project will actively involve members of this community in the effort to transform Downtown Merced and to make this vital part of town a more attractive, desirable and safer place to visit, shop and dine. The project creates the opportunity for people from all different walks of life to come together and contribute equally and positively.

- Empowers both individuals and the community


### Resources needed to complete the project



I am volunteering my time to organize and teach all the glazing workshops and will fire the glazed poppies and lupines. I will also oversee the installation of the mosaic at no cost.

## **Project Time Table**


- Finish making all the mosaic components by the beginning of summer vacation in June
