**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF  
THE CITY OF MERCED, CALIFORNIA, ACTING  
AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THE  
COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2003-2  
(SERVICES) OF THE CITY OF MERCED,  
AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2018-38 TO  
CORRECT EXHIBIT A THERETO RELATING TO  
THE ANNUAL SPECIAL TAX FOR SAID  
DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019**

WHEREAS, the City Council (the “Legislative Body”) of the City of Merced, California (the “City”) had previously initiated proceedings, held public hearings, conducted elections and received a favorable vote from the qualified electors to authorize the levy of special taxes in and for the Community Facilities District No. 2003-2 (Services) of the City of Merced (the “District”), including Annexation Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, all as authorized pursuant to the terms and provisions of the “Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982,” being Chapter 2.5, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California (the “Act”); and

WHEREAS, on June 4, 2018, the Legislative Body of the City adopted Resolution No. 2018-38 authorizing the establishment of an annual special tax for Fiscal Year 2018-2019 at the tax rate set forth in Exhibit A, attached to said Resolution; and

WHEREAS, due to a typographical error on Exhibit A relating to Improvement Area 35, it is necessary to correct the Exhibit to reflect the correct special tax rate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MERCED, ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THE COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2003-2 (SERVICES) OF THE CITY OF MERCED, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The above recitals are all true and correct.

SECTION 2. In accordance with the Act and the Ordinance, there is hereby levied upon all parcels within the District, which are not otherwise exempt from taxation under the Act or the Ordinance, the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2018-

2019 at the tax rate set forth in the Exhibit "A" (Corrected), which rates do not exceed the maximum rates set forth in the Ordinance. After adoption of this Resolution, the District may make any necessary modifications to these special taxes to account for any unforeseen circumstances; provided, however, that any such modifications shall not result in an increase in the tax applicable to a category and can only be made prior to the submission of the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Certified List to the County Auditor.

SECTION 3. The Finance Officer is hereby authorized and directed to prepare or cause the preparation of the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Certified List and to submit such list to the County Auditor on or before August 10th or such later date to which the County Auditor may agree.

SECTION 4. The special tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary *ad valorem* property taxes are collected, and shall be subject to the same penalties and same procedure and sale in cases of any delinquency for *ad valorem* taxes, and the Tax Collector is hereby authorized to deduct reasonable administrative costs incurred in collecting any said special tax.

SECTION 5. It is hereby further directed that a certified copy of this Resolution, together with the Certified List for Fiscal Year 2018-2019, also be filed with the County Auditor.

SECTION 6. The County Auditor is hereby directed to enter in the next County assessment roll on which taxes will become due, opposite each lot or parcel of land effected in a space marked "public services, special tax" or by any other suitable designation, the installment of the special tax.

SECTION 7. The County Auditor shall then, at the close of the tax collection period, promptly render to the District a detailed report showing the amount and/or amounts of such special tax installments, interest, penalties and percentages so collected and from what property collected, and also provide a statement of any percentages retained for the expense of making any such collection.

SECTION 8. This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.
