Pilot Campaign Objectives

- **Public Outreach**
 - Banners, Posters, Yard Signs, Stickers, Utility Bill Insert, Radio Interviews, Radio Ads, Social Media Campaign, Press Conference, Public Services Announcements Video.
- **Safe Surrender Day/ Seizure of Illegal Fireworks**
 - Provide the public the opportunity to dispose of fireworks, both legal and illegal fireworks without fear of prosecution.



Pilot Campaign Objectives

- Tip lines-
 - Provided multiple methods to report illegal fireworks instead of the 9-1-1 system.
 - Celebrate Safe hotline, Merced Connect App and dedicated email address.
 - Expanded dispatch center on July 3 and 4th staffed with City volunteers.
- Enforcement
 - Merced City Fire and Police conducted surveillance of social media for the illegal sale and distribution of illegal fireworks.
 - Increased patrol enforcement and Fire Department personnel on July 3rd and 4th.

Enforcement before the 4th

Arrested five (5) people in three (3) cases for the sale of illegal fireworks

In total, approx. 650 pounds of illegal fireworks were taken off the streets.



Safe Surrender Day

- Held on Saturday June 30, 2018 at Fire Station 51 from 9:00-1:00
- Allowed the public to dispose of any fireworks (safe and sane or illegal) safely and without any fear of prosecution.
- Two individuals surrendered illegal fireworks and when doing so they thanked us for our efforts to address illegal fireworks.
- Two couples stopped by the station just to say thank you for the Celebrate Safe program. They expressed gratitude that the City was addressing the issues associated with illegal fireworks.

Celebrate Safe Hotline Results

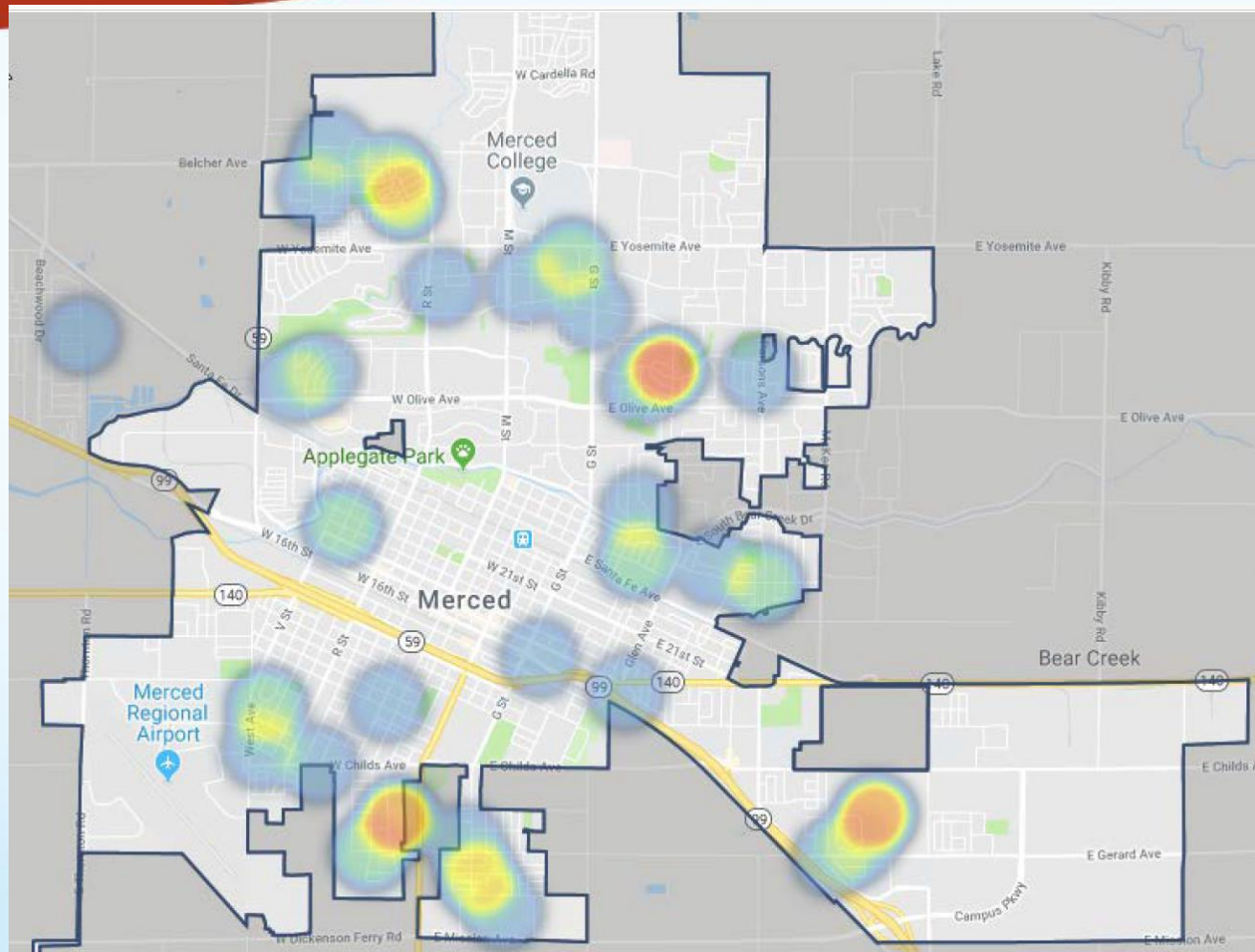
- **The Celebrate Safe hotline answered 340 calls. Without the hotline, the calls would have been made directly into our dispatch center on 9-1-1 lines or other emergency/business numbers.**
- **More than 20 calls to the hotline were reporting incidents in Planada, Delhi, Atwater and in the County of Merced.**
- **These stats shows community buy-in for the program and that the public outreach campaign was effective.**



Celebrate Safe Hotline results

- **Six calls into the hotline were directly transferred to Dispatch as the caller was reporting a non-firework emergency.**
- **Negative- callers often reported fireworks being discharged in vicinities (i.e., near Burbank school) and not a specific address. Also, many callers refused to provide their name or call back numbers.**
- **Next year we will need more volunteers to staff the hotline on July 4th.**

Heat Maps of Illegal Fireworks Reports



- Information technology produced maps of the City showing the areas highest call (Complaint) volume.
- This assisted with enforcement.
- Provides good data for subsequent year's efforts.

Fire Cause

- 7 fire incidents occurred on July 4th.
- All were arson caused and fireworks related.
- One was a residential fire.
- Six were vegetation fires.



Enforcement on July 3rd and 4th

- **Staffing on July 3rd**
 - Fire Chief, 2 Deputy Fire Chiefs, 1 Fire Investigator, and 1 resource officer.
 - Police Chief, 1 Lieutenant, 1 Dispatch supervisor, 2 dispatchers, 2 call takers, 1 sergeant, and 5 officers.
- **Staffing on July 4th**
 - Fire Chief, 2 Deputy Fire Chiefs, 2 Fire Investigator, and 1 resource officer, 1 Engine Company (three personnel)
 - 1 Sergeant , 3 officers, 2 dispatchers, 1 call taker.
- **Citations**
 - The Fire and Police Department personnel issued twelve administrative citations and confiscated illegal fireworks.

Lessons Learned

- **Enforcement of the sale and use of illegal fireworks should increase next year to reduce the use of Illegal Fireworks.**
- **Additional police officers and fire investigators should be scheduled to work the special detail, especially on July 4th.**
- **Expanded dispatch greatly reduced the number of calls into the 9-1-1 center.**



Lessons Learned from Pilot

- The addition of the engine company assisted in handling the emergency incidents on the peak of the 4th of July.
- The addition of a resource officer in the dispatch center helped make maximum use of limited Fire Department resources.
- A code approved storage unit should be obtained for the safe storage of illegal fireworks and combustible and flammable materials/liquids.



Lessons Learned from Pilot

- The tip line, Merced Connect, and email assisted the public in reporting the sale and use of illegal fireworks.
- Reluctant reporters – the public did not want to provide contact information.
- Future public relations campaigns should stress the need for cooperation by residents.

Lessons Learned from Pilot

- Consider ways to effectuate a community culture change regarding the use of illegal fireworks.
- Learn from other entities. Review their debriefings and enforcement efforts. For example, Sacramento has a Fireworks Mitigation Task Force that includes two ATF agents.
- Host an illegal fireworks forum in early 2019.
- Consider organizing a public pyrotechnic show to help reduce the number of illegal fireworks being used in the City.
