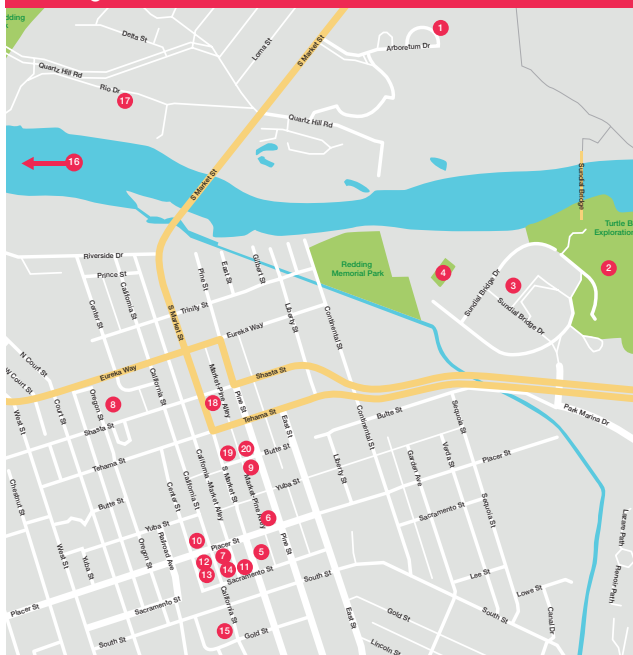
Cultural District
