Barbara HUNT, Applicant from Advanced Air - explained the security check points that are enforced by the Department of Transportation (DOT), operation of contract with DOT, price of fuel and salaries rising, the sustainability of the company's operation, and the potential of going out to bid.

Council, Mr. SANDUSKY, and Ms. HUNT discussed the potential safety risk, profits of Advanced Air, DOT's requirement for the operator to arrive

to a medium or large hub, the shuttle bus, large corporations flying with the Advanced Air, details of safety and security measures, the bid process, original recommendation made by Council, amount of savings and profit, fees paid to LAX, percentage of community support, and the cost-saving for residents.
