SUBJECT: Approval of a First Amendment with Modesto Industrial Electrical Company, Inc., for the Supply and Delivery of Electrical/Mechanical Parts and Repair/Installation Services adding the not to Exceed Amount of \$50,000, Totaling \$110,000 for the 2021-22 Fiscal Year

### REPORT IN BRIEF

Considers approving a First Amendment to a Supply and Services Agreement with Modesto Industrial Electrical Company, Inc., for additional parts and services through June 30, 2022.

#### RECOMMENDATION

**City Council** - Adopt a motion approving the First Amendment with Modesto Industrial Electrical Company, Inc. for the supply and delivery of electrical/mechanical parts and repair/installation services in the additional amount not to exceed \$50,000, totaling \$110,000 for Fiscal Year 2021-22; and authorizing the City Manager or Deputy City Manager to execute the necessary documents.

#### AUTHORITY

Merced Municipal Code Chapter 3.04, Article III - Purchases over Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars.

#### CITY COUNCIL PRIORITIES

As provided for in the 2021/2022 Adopted Budget.

#### DISCUSSION

On November 1, 2021, Council approved waiving competitive bidding and entering into a Supply and Services agreement with Modesto Industrial Electrical Company, Inc. (IEC), in the amount not to exceed \$60,000 for various electrical/mechanical parts and repair/installation services.

The Public Works Department utilizes this vendor for materials and services needed for regular maintenance, unforeseen repair work, or work related to vehicle accidents that damage City infrastructure. This includes the purchase of irrigation pumps needed to maintain the City's parks, as

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well as parts and materials for the maintenance of well sites.

Due to maintenance needs, as well as increased costs of parts and supplies, staff is recommending an increase to the contract to continue with needed maintenance.

# **IMPACT ON CITY RESOURCES**

No appropriation of funds is needed; funding is available within the FY 2021/2022 adopted budget. The contract is utilized by several Public Works divisions.
